

# CSR Options for Single Day Events

We are delighted to hear from you!

There are around 750,000 migrant workers in Singapore, and we are in touch with group sizes ranging from 10 workers to 10,000 workers per location and everything in between.

There are many ways that corporate groups or companies can help – we have some ongoing, structured programs – but we are always open to a conversation if you would like to discuss a specific way in which you want to help. Listed below are a few current options but this is not an exhaustive list, we do a lot more on an ongoing basis.

# **Weekday Options**





# Carepacking & Distribution

Corporates can choose to organise a carepacking session at their own office or a preferred space. A minimum of 50 care packs is recommended for smaller worksites. IRR can coordinate with site supervisors to arrange a short 30–45 minute distribution event, where volunteers can personally hand out the items. Please note that most worksites allow only 10 or fewer volunteers to enter. If you have more volunteers who also want to be part of the distribution, we encourage splitting across multiple worksites so everyone can participate.

IRR cannot allocate worksites based on location preference, and dates and times are subject to the worksite's availability.



This half-day activity is fully self-run. All costs are borne by the corporate, and IRR staff or volunteers will not be present. Remote guidance can be provided if needed.



# Lunch Sponsorship & Distribution

Corporate volunteers can sponsor lunch meals such as bento boxes, burgers, or pizzas. IRR can coordinate with site supervisors to organise a short 30–45 minute distribution event, where volunteers can personally hand out the items. Volunteers may also opt for a drive-by distribution to any road workers nearby.

IRR cannot allocate worksites based on location preference, and dates and times are subject to the worksite's availability.

Please note that sit-down meal sessions are not available on weekdays. If you prefer a sit-down meal, refer to our Makan with Migrant Workers initiative in the Weekend Options section of this brochure.

This half-day activity is fully self-run. All costs are covered by the corporate, and IRR staff or volunteers will not be present. Remote guidance can be provided if needed.





# Manager for a Day

Join us for a 1–2 hour shift and experience the meaningful work that happens daily at inspirRe. As a volunteer, you'll help sort and restock donations and prepare the store for the weekend, when workers visit. This is a chance to support our mission while gaining insight into the needs of the community we serve. Please note that there is **no direct engagement with migrant workers** for this activity.

Sessions are available on weekdays (except Wednesdays) at 10:30 AM or 2:00 PM. Weekend slots (4 participants max) may be arranged depending on staff availability. Each weekday session can host up to 20 participants.

Companies are required to contribute \$100 per participant, either through in-kind donations of **brand-new** items or monetary contributions to purchase essential items for the store.

This experience provides a closer look at the dedication behind each shift and fosters a deeper appreciation for our volunteers and the migrant workers we support.


# Makan with Migrant Brothers

Makan with Migrant Workers is an initiative by IRR that fosters meaningful connection between the community and migrant workers through a shared meal.

To foster deeper engagement, we recommend a 1 volunteer to 5 workers ratio. Meals can be hosted at a dormitory (subject to their approval), restaurant, or your own space, with group size adjusted based on venue capacity. Please provide Halal and vegetarian options to respect dietary needs.

IRR will help broadcast the opportunity and secure worker sign-ups. All event planning, coordination, and costs (e.g. catering, logistics) will be managed and covered by the corporate host.

Sharing a meal is a simple way to build understanding – and a moment that leaves a lasting impact for all involved.





# Workshops & Sports Activities

Hosting a workshop is a meaningful way to equip migrant workers with practical skills that enhance their daily lives. Popular topics include Microsoft Excel, AI, AutoCAD, digital literacy, as well as yoga, first aid, and financial literacy. Beyond learning, these sessions foster connection, confidence, and a strong sense of community.

For a more informal option, corporates can also host a one-day sports day, giving workers a fun and refreshing break from their daily routines.

These activities can be held at any of the Recreation Centres for Migrant Workers booked through IRR.

Your involvement can create a lasting impact in the lives of those we serve.

**Hari Raya Haji:** The much-celebrated Annual Potluck returns, featuring local favorites like roti prata, curry puffs, and ice cream, while workers receive gifts and enjoy a range of fun, meaningful activities.

**Deepavali:** There are more than 1 million workers in Singapore and our goal is to send samosas and pizzas to as many workers as we can.

**Christmas:** Let us come together to wrap presents and distribute brand new presents to as many workers as we can.

More details on each activity will be shared 1-2 months before the respective festive season.

# Guidelines for CSR Activities with IRR

Please note that CSR activities with IRR will proceed only if the corporate agrees to the following:

- For any activities involving participation of migrant workers, the migrant workers will be recruited from IRR's channels and network of workers.
- For all external events, volunteers from IRR will only be requested if there are sufficient tasks for them to participate in. Volunteer availability cannot be guaranteed, and the corporate should ensure there is adequate manpower to run the activity independently. Remote support from IRR can be provided if required.
- Funds donated to IRR will be used solely for expenses directly related to our beneficiaries and/or our charity.
- Any payments that IRR needs to make on behalf of the corporate will only be processed to Singapore bank accounts. IRR does not conduct foreign transactions.
- IRR will not make any physical purchases. Purchases can only be made from online platforms that offer delivery services.
